

How to Arrange for a Pool Party (2023)

<u>Up to four (4) guests during normal pool hours</u> - A homeowner/resident, who has current year pool tags, can bring up to four (4) guests to the pool without first contacting TAE, the pool management company.

- Guests cannot live in HBTM.
- A homeowner/resident can only bring four (4) guests per household; it does not mean that each person in a household can bring four (4) guests.
- The homeowner must stay with their guests and ensure that their guests comply with the Pool Rules and Regulations.
- The Guest Log Sheet shall be completed by each guest and each guest shall pay a fee of \$1.00 per person per day. Guest shall take a yellow pool tag that must be returned when leaving pool.

More than four (4) guests during normal pool hours or to have a party outside of normal pool hours – If a homeowner/resident, who has current year pool tags, wants to invite more than four (4) guests during regular pool hours or have a party outside of normal pool hours, homeowner/resident shall contact TAE at their website (www.taepools.com) on the Parties tab at least ten (10) business days prior to the event to make such arrangements. All arrangements and your agreement for the pool party will be with TAE.

Typically, no pool parties will be scheduled during Holiday Weekends or on Holidays and requests for parties after August 1st may not be met.

Once the pool closes for the season, no additional private parties will be allowed as lifeguards will not be available.

Non-Residents of HBTM - Non-residents of HBTM can make arrangements with TAE to use the pool for parties. In addition to the costs associated with the TAE agreement, there will also be a charge of \$25.00 per person per day payable to HBTM HOA. This money is to be given to TAE for pick-up by HBTM HOA at a later date. All the other requirements stated above and as per the agreement with TAE will apply.

Playground - The playground area cannot be reserved for private parties.
